

Mehrangarh, located in Jodhpur, Raiasthan is one of the largest forts in India. Within the fort, there are seven gates, including the Jayapol (meaning 'victory gate'), built by Maharaja Man Singh to commemorate his victories over Jaipur and Bikaner armies. There is also a Fattehpol (also meaning 'victory gate'), which commemorates Maharaja Ajit Singh's victory over the Mughals. Loha Pol was constructed in 15th century but its facade was constructed by Maharaja Maldeo in 16th century. The pol has the handprints of 15 queens who performed sati or jauhar.

Why is it called 'Mehrangarh'? ANS: Mehrangarh means "Fort of the sun", a reference to the clan's (Rajput clan called Rathores) mythical descent from the sun god Surya.



We are all well acquainted with the abundance of talent that our children are instilled with, and our institution has always tried to provide a platform where these latent, beads of one rosary.


